THE A56 SOUTHBOUND WILL BE CLOSED

03:00 – 16:00 Deansgate Interchange to Edge Lane
07:30 – 19:30 Edge Lane to Ashfield Road (one lane open to access M60 from Green Street)
07:30 – 16:00 Ashfield Road to Stamford Brook Road

THE A56 NORTHBOUND WILL BE CLOSED

03:00 – 19:30 Barton Road to Edge Lane
06:30 – 16:00 White City Circle to A5014 Chester Road
03:00 – 16:00 Edge Lane to White City Circle
07:30 – 16:00 Stamford Brook Road to Barton Road
07:30 – 14:00 A5014 to Deansgate Interchange

BEST ADVICE

If you need to use the A56 southbound use the outer diversion route A5103 Princess Road (Princess Parkway) to avoid major disruption to your journey. If you need to access the city during the northbound closure use A5181 Barton Road, and then B5211 Barton Dock Road to the A57, and then follow signs for the city. Alternatively, after 16:00 when A56 north will be open use Barton Road, and then Kingsway to re-join A56 into the City.

M60 JUNCTION 7 06:30 – 19:00

There is no exit from the M60 at junction 7 in either direction. Traffic travelling in both directions that wish to leave the M60 at junction 7 will need to leave at junction 6, 8 or 9 dependent on their destination. Access onto the M60 at junction 7 will be restricted - the anticlockwise on slip road will remain accessible only for vehicles from the Stretford Meadows Estate. The clockwise on slip road

will remain accessible only for vehicles from the Sale Travelodge. Both these options are for use ONLY by drivers & vehicles that comply with Motorway driving regulations.

PARKING RESTRICTIONS

Parking restrictions will be in place from 23:00 on Saturday 15 April until 22:00 on Sunday 16 April. The exact details are specific to each area. Specific information will be displayed across the route in the final weeks before the event and is also available on the interactive map.

PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Road closures will be in effect along the route and those roads that aren't closed will likely be very busy. Many bus services will also be diverted due to the closures. We recommend using the Metrolink to travel to and from the race as there are several stops close to the start and finish in Trafford. The tram system will be very busy so leave extra time. VEHICLE CROSSING POINTS

Please see the map overleaf and interactive map for further details. Vehicle Crossing Points are open for set times only and are not open throughout the event. In some unavoidable circumstances access may be slightly delayed or shorter than stated. In this unlikely instance we will do our best to communicate delays through the stewards at each location.

UNAUTHORISED ACCESS

Please be aware a road closure notice is an enforceable legal order and riding/driving any kind of vehicle on the route when unauthorised to do so will result in police action. The same applies for no parking notices, which if not followed may result in a vehicle being towed away at the expense of the owner.

What If We Need The Emergency Services...

Access for vehicles on a 999 emergency call is possible to all areas. We work closely with Greater Manchester Emergency Services both during planning & in event control on the day to ensure that all areas affected by the road closures can still be reached by Emergency Services on a blue light 999 call.

The Route Is Closed To Pedestrians...

The roads are closed to all road users including cyclists & cars etc but the pavements are open and pedestrians can use them, and cross over the route roads when safe to do so.

The Cost To Manchester Residents &/or the NHS...

All planning & event costs such as road closures, stewarding, medical cover, equipment etc

are paid for and covered by us, the event organisers.

Littering...

We have teams to collect litter from the event and dispose of it correctly. Where possible our aim is to recycle as much as we can. We recycled over 1.54 tonnes of waste after the Manchester Marathon last April.

IMPORTANT ROAD CLOSURE INFORMATION FOR RESIDENTS + BUSINESSES SUNDAY 16 APRIL 2023

The adidas Manchester Marathon will see 28,000 runners take to the streets of Manchester & Trafford in April.

This leaflet has been delivered to your premises because it is either directly on the race route or a short distance from it, and may be affected by the road closures and parking restrictions.

The start will be as before on the A56 near the White City Arch. The route then takes a loop into the city centre, showcasing some of the city's most iconic landmarks.

The route continues South along the A56 towards

Timperley & Altrincham before circling back via Sale and heading back to its popular finish near Lancashire Cricket Club.

Arrangements for the event are subject to review and evaluation every year in order to facilitate a safe event for all.
